





Has your organization received grant funding in the last three years for collections care? 3. Why is having a preservation needs assessment appropriate for your organization at this time? 4. What are your organizational goals for a preservation needs assessment? Comment on specific concerns 5. and goals for the survey, and check-off all relevant goals below. Collections: develop a long-range preservation plan improve collections care conserve treasures

Budget Tips

- > \$30,000 maximum request size
- A Hypothetical First Year Request: Preservation Needs Assessment (\$6,000)
 - + Collections Management Policies (\$6,000)
 - + Emergency Plan (\$12,000) =
 - A \$24,000 request
- ➤ A Hypothetical Response: \$12,000 granted for an Emergency Plan

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
