HBCU Librarians Chosen for Exchange Program with ASERL Libraries

HBCU Library Alliance and the Association of Southeastern Research Libraries (ASERL) are pleased to announce the selection of five associate-level librarians from the Library Alliance Leadership Program to participate in a pilot exchange program with five member libraries of ASERL during the summer of 2006. Funded by a \$20,000 grant from The Andrew W. Mellon Foundation, the goals of the exchange are to provide the HBCU librarians with an opportunity to address specific issues of strategic importance to their respective libraries with the assistance and expertise of ASERL library leaders, and to foster additional collaboration between ASERL and HBCU libraries. The project also includes a site visit by the participating ASERL library dean to the HBCU library prior to the exchange.

The participants were selected for their potential for leadership as demonstrated by a record of past achievement, ability to articulate the leadership need regarding the strategic area identified as the focus of the exchange, a history of creative contribution to organizational problem-solving, and experience in effective engagement within and outside of the library to improve library service. The match between each librarian and the institution was based upon the librarian's strategic focus and the expertise of the ASERL institution in that area.
